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What are Redways?

You can use Redways to walk, cycle and wheel!
They're sometimes red, but not always. You may even come across a robot or a scooter. Redways can help you get to school safely. There's over 200 miles of Redways across Milton Keynes.

Using the Redways?

-  Walk on the right
-  Cycle on the left side
-  Only walk or cycle as a two
-  Slow down as you go around bends and at junctions – always be prepared to stop!

Keeping safe on the Redways

It is important to keep yourself and others safe using the Redways.

-  Don't listen to music too loudly and be aware of what's around you
-  Let others pass if it becomes busy
-  When passing others let them know by politely telling them or using a bell on your bike
-  Give other users space and slow down when you overtake them
-  Take your rubbish home or put it in the nearest bin

Getting Around

If you see a yellow bollard, slow down, it probably means you are near a road or junction.



If you see a white triangle it means **give way**. You do this by stopping to let traffic pass before you and only crossing when it's safe to do so.
